- Keen to develop and apply your knowledge and skills to bring about improvements in the healthcare system?
- A self-starter, motivated and willing to shape a stretching and rewarding Fellowship year?

What is the Multiprofessional Fellowship in Simulation?

The aims of this Fellowship are to:

- Support the professional and academic development of healthcare professionals from a range of backgrounds
- Bring benefits to the healthcare system in which they are working through their project work on the programme

This year-long Fellowship involves around 40% FTE protected time dedicated to a combination of:

- Project based learning aligned to the NHS Long Term Workforce Plan with a focus on utilising simulation to expand placement capacity within primary care settings.
- Learning and collaborating with other Fellows on the programme from a range of healthcare professions
- Fellows will be part of the KSS Primary Care Simulation Faculty and work closely with the KSS GP Fellow Lead in Simulation and the other KSS Simulation Fellows.

- Academic postgraduate level studies, tailored to the needs of the individual from a choice of PG Cert programmes or specific stand-alone modules.

Where the fellow does not have prior academic qualifications in simulation this could be stand-alone simulation modules offered by BSMS or the full simulation in clinical practice PGCert or if they have previously undertaken simulation specific academic study they can choose from other programmes offered by BSMS such as leadership in healthcare or digital health.

Where are the Fellowships based?

The Multiprofessional Fellowship in Simulation is supported by NHSE WT&E KSS and SIM-TEL (South East) and managed by Brighton and Sussex Medical School (BSMS).

Fellows will hold a substantive post within the ICS region where they are applying.

It is expected that the project work will span across the KSS footprint and give opportunity for organisations in the local health systems to develop multiprofessional networks.
