

ARCP Requirements 2018

Whilst there are no changes to previously advertised ARCP requirements this year, trainees and educators may find the following documents helpful when preparing for their ARCP panels. GP training is a trainee-led process, so it's your responsibility to ensure the relevant evidence is available in your eportfolio in good time for your ARCP panel:

- Combined trainee ARCP guidance booklet 2018 L&KSS
- ST1-3 GP ARCP Requirements 2018 L&KSS

ESR and ARCP Dates for forthcoming panels

ARCP panels for out of sync trainees, who will receive personal notifications, are scheduled for

- 12th April 2018
- 15th May 2018

ESRs for ST3s finishing training in July/August 2018 should be completed by 28TH MAY 2018

The main Summer ARCP panels for ST3 will take place on:

- 14th & 15th June 2018
- 18th & 19th June 2018

ESRs for ST1 & 2 should be completed by 25th June 2018

The main Summer panels for ST 1 & 2 will take place on:

- 16th & 17th July 2018
- 19th & 20th July 2018

Please ensure you have booked your ESR meeting with your ES in good time for these deadlines. By ensuring you have presented all the relevant e-portfolio evidence by the ESR date, you can avoid the need to be called for a face to face panel.

AudioCOT assessments

General Practice has evolved, and more and more consultations (currently 12%) are being carried out by phone. Different skills are needed to carry out a consultation safely and appropriately on the phone from those needed for face-to-face consultation.

The Audio-COT form that has been developed would be expected to be used for at least one COT in ST3, and further ones would be encouraged. A total of three Audio-COTs can contribute towards the overall total of COTs required in ST3. For current ST3s this is **OPTIONAL**.

Audio-COT would not be expected as part of the minimum numbers of COTs in ST1/2. The AudioCOT is encouraged in ST1/2 whilst in a GP placement but it will not count towards the overall total number of COTs in these training years. <u>More information and guidance is available here</u>.

ARCP – HEE review findings

Dear Colleague

I am delighted that HEE has launched the report setting out the findings from our major review of the Annual Review of Competency Progression (ARCP).

As the process by which we check that doctors in training are safe to practice and are progressing, the ARCP clearly needs to be consistent and equitable wherever and however you are training. But equally important is the need for feedback during training.

I know how valuable an excellent appraisal and feedback process can be to individual doctors. It can help you see your strengths and identify where you are doing well and help career decisions. Equally, it can flag areas for further development and where additional support may be needed.

This review was inspired by doctors in training. They told us they found the process stressful, that it varied from area to area and felt like a tick box exercise without providing them with the support or feedback they needed. Therefore, as part of the review, we set out to listen to the voices of doctors in training, those who train them, those who set their curricula, their employers and those who work alongside them in our multi-professional teams plus patients and leaders across the system. In addition to numerous stakeholder engagement events, we ran a call for evidence, so that we could include the views of individuals as well as the members of the many working groups chaired by members of HEE's clinical leadership.

You can ready the report on our <u>website</u> For me, the key themes are that the ARCP process should support greater flexibility in our training pathways, and better opportunities for all learners to have meaningful feedback on their performance. This will empower doctors in their training decisions and help them balance their careers and personal lives. It also highlighted the need to support the development of multi-professional teams with the assured recognised competencies to manage current challenging workloads and provide the best care for patients. A central and recurrent theme was the key role of educational supervisors and how important it is to have time for high quality supervision.

Study Leave Changes

All medical trainees have access to study budget funding to support their development while training. This money is often used in a variety of ways, supporting regional teaching, supporting access to mandatory curricula learning objects or specific training courses.

Why is the study budget changing?

As trainees, you said: -

- You were frustrated with the current system for accessing study budgets
- You had inconsistent and inequitable experiences when applying for study leave and funding which varied across geographical regions and clinical specialties
- You paid for most of your educational courses/activities personally with expenses infrequently reimbursed.

In response, Health Education England (HEE) did the following: -

- Proposed study budget changes to address trainee concerns as part of the initiative 'Enhancing Junior Doctors' Working Lives'
- Established management of the study leave budget centrally through its local offices to nationally improve study leave access, educational training and funding support for all trainees.

Further information can be found <u>here</u>. Trainees will continue to request study leave at a local level through their education supervisor in accordance with agreed curriculum delivery lists. The Schools across KSS are drawing up these lists with trainee engagement. Further information on this will be shared with you and we anticipate that FAQs which trainee reps on the study leave group for the region are developing, together with the lists, will be available on the support portal through March as they are finalised.

Academy of Medical Royal Colleges Guidance for Entering Information Onto E-Portfolios

As we are sure you are aware, there have been concerns amongst doctors about how they should best use their eportfolios to record reflections on their clinical work, especially when they have made a medical error, or a patient has come to harm. This is a particular worry for doctors in training programmes, who are required to provide evidence of reflection as part of their learning.

With this in mind, COPMeD and the Academy have updated their <u>guidance</u> to help doctors in training, and their supervisors, in considering how to record their reflective practice.

Careers support

Post CCT Academic GP Fellowships

Not sure what to do after completing your training? HEE are supporting 19 post CCT fellowships spread across KSS which may be the answer for you:

What is a GP Academic Fellowship?

A one-year programme based on an indicative 10 sessions per week

- 4 Sessions per week working as a fully qualified salaried GP
 - 4 sessions per week working in in an organisation to support development in a clinical (or educational) area of practice to develop expertise
 - GP practice in more specialised areas of work aligned to a clinical specialism
 - o Community / secondary care provider
 - 2 sessions per week undertaking an academic programme

The programme can be undertaken part time but the balance across the clinical areas should be similar and it would usually be the intention the academic component was completed within one year.

If you think this could be for you, speak with your Programme Directors as soon as possible – since we are currently in negotiations with local areas to identify both geographical and clinical areas of interest. If your interests and those of the local CCG align this could be a really interesting opportunity for you.

This year we are pleased to offer a development day for Kent and Medway GP educators together **with** our GP trainees. This has been one of your requests in recurring feedback. The theme for the day is *cultural and intergenerational awareness*. At this stage please can you save the date: **27th June 2018**. International GP recruitment initiative

Bids from Kent, Surrey and Sussex STPs for the International GP (IGP) Recruitment initiative have all been successful. HEE is collaborating closely with NHS England, who are running this initiative to support workforce shortages across the patch.

Kent and Medway will commence in the first wave, with recruitment companies commencing their activity in April. HEE will support the initial interviews over skype. Following on, the international GPs will be travelling to the UK for a "meet and greet" weekend and a second interview. This will be the opportunity for the practices hosting these doctors to meet the GPs and for there to be a matching process. In preparation for hosting international GPs, practices will need to have a trained clinical supervisor, who has attended the relevant course and been approved as such.

HEE will be seeking educators for both the first and second interviews. Educators will be required to train and support the new clinical supervisors and act as external educator supervisor (EES). EES can be current GP trainers or have previously been approved GP trainers, who remain in clinical practice. Former trainers will be required to attend training. Programme Directors will be running regular educational sessions to support the international GPs. I appreciate those of you, who have already contacted myself or one of the Patch Associate Deans to offer and agree your help formally and informally. Once the details about dates and remuneration are agreed, we will be sharing the details with those, who have registered an interest. Anyone else interested to have a
