[GP ST1/2 teaching](#)

Following on from the GP trainee survey organized by the GP Specialty Trainee Rep Committee over the last year, it has been possible to clarify the GP-specific training which should be on offer to GP trainees across HEE KSS during their first two years in programme:

- GP ST1/2 training attendance is MANDATORY
- It should be considered protected time
- A total amount of training equivalent to 1 hour per week should be provided
- This may be delivered in less frequent, longer sessions, depending on local arrangements
- Attendance should be monitored locally, and any issues with this teaching should be raised via the existing LFG/LAB process in the first instance, before being raised then with the GP School
- Study leave will only be required for sessions which exceed 2 hours, and provided it is requested in line with trust policy, will not be withheld
- This is in addition to any departmental teaching, which should continue as before

This guidance has been agreed with the HEE KSS-wide CTAG (Clinical Tutors Advisory Group), which includes representation from all acute and psychiatric trusts. We are most grateful for their support in confirming this vital educational time for GP trainees.

The GMC and HEE across Kent Surrey and Sussex are preparing for the National Training Survey that will

again take place in 2016.

The survey census date will be **22nd MARCH 2016** and **must** be completed by all trainees who are in post on that date – responses relating to their post on that date. This is your chance to influence training in the future – do not miss that chance.

The survey will be open from 22nd March – 4th May 2016. Any trainees that are Out Of Programme (OOP) on the census date are not expected to complete the survey.

THE GP SCHOOL WOULD LIKE TO REMIND ALL TRAINEES THAT UNDERTAKING THIS SURVEY IS A PROFESSIONAL RESPONSIBILITY and GP Trainers and Programme Directors are asked to encourage all GPStRs to complete the survey. HEE KSS has previously achieved 100% completion.

[Safeguarding training requirements](#)

GP trainees are reminded that they are required to demonstrate **annual** evidence of child safeguarding training in their e-portfolio. In ST1/2 level 2 training is sufficient, although the expectation would be that if they have been in GP or Paediatrics level 3 would be expected. It is particularly important in the ST3 year, when level 3 training **must** be demonstrated. This should be clearly marked as an e-portfolio entry, including reflection on learning, and should be confirmed by the ES in their final review.

Surrey Physician Associates Programme
