The formal teaching programme includes cadre specific teaching, specialty teaching, departmental grand rounds, M&M meetings, governance meetings and simulation.

It has a very high turnover and a variety of patients presenting to the hospital, the majority of the patients are new patients admitted to the hospital who are referred from the Emergency Department, are direct GP referrals or through the Ambulatory Care Unit. There are opportunities to observe and perform bedside procedures and learn ultrasound skills, as well as liaising with community services, IDT and H@HT.

	You will be supported during your time at Dartford and Gravesham NHS Trust by the College Tutor, a GMC approved named Educational Supervisor and a number of Clinical Supervisors, all of whom will contribute to your learning and educational development, complete work-based assessments and provide you with regular feedback regarding your progress.
	Medical education is delivered via a number of learning approaches, including ward round clinical teaching, anaesthetic teaching programme, simulation and for the anaesthetic part of your attachment attending theatres and participating to a list with a clinical supervisor.
	The Anaesthetic Department offers training in General, Laparoscopic Colorectal, Urological Surgeries, Orthopaedics and Trauma, Gynaecology. The aim is to give you the opportunity to improve both your knowledge and practical skills when dealing with critically ill patients. You will have the opportunity to get some anaesthetic experience but the main focus will remain intensive care. Due to the very specialised nature of the specialty you will be supernumerary and will have "on call" duties only during day time and always under the direct supervision of a more senior doctor in training and close supervision from a consultant.

 Attain basic knowledge across a spectrum of medical specialties common to the needs of a general physician Develop a solid platform of knowledge, competencies and experience sufficient to allow progression to enter specialty training in medicine Learn team working, time management and clinical prioritisation skills.
Sub Specialty: <u>Orthogeriatrics:</u> Maple Ward is the trauma and orthopaedics ward at DVH. The majority of patients here are frail older people, most commonly following hip fracture. Following surgery, the team look after those patients with post-operative complications (e.g. delirium, infection, difficult discharge decisions and ethical issues). Medical support is also given to the orthopaedic teams in managing non hip-fracture patients. The focus is, in addition, on falls prevention and bone health assessment. This is in addition to managing general medicine patients. The ward is supported by a dedicated Trauma Nurse for Older People.
Endocrinology and Diabetes: Beech Ward is a D&E and general medicine ward; patients here are mainly a mixture of medical cases, which include elderly care patients, alongside patients with primary diabetic or endocrine conditions. The department offers a very active diabetes service and an evolving metabolic bone disease services, with regular outpatient clinics and also seeing inpatient referrals. It is supported by the diabetic CNS's.
Haematology / General Medicine: Holly ward is the Haematology ward but also looks after patients with acute Oncology presentations and general medicine. The haematology patients are cared by five full time Haematology consultants on a weekly rota and the Acute Oncology Service, which is supported by General Medicine Consultants, with the collaboration by visiting Oncology consultants based in Maidstone Hospital. Day Unit services are provided in Pine Therapy, where in addition to giving routine chemotherapy and supportive treatments as blood transfusions, cancer outpatients with febrile neutropenia or other acute problems are seen. Outpatients Service are a combination of Virtual/telephone plus face to face clinics, with provision of some outpatient services within Pine for selected patients for urgent management. In addition, there are provisions for PICC line insertions and bone marrow procedures.

Sub Specialty: <u>Orthogeriatrics:</u> Maple Ward is the trauma and orthopaedics ward at DVH. The majority of patients here are frail older people, most commonly following hip fracture. Following surgery, the team look after those patients with post-operative complications (e.g. delirium, infection, difficult discharge decisions and ethical issues). Medical support is also given to the orthopaedic teams in managing non hip-fracture patients. The focus is, in addition, on falls prevention and bone health assessment. This is in addition to managing general medicine patients. The ward is supported by a dedicated Trauma Nurse for Older People.
Endocrinology and Diabetes: Beech Ward is a D&E and general medicine ward; patients here are mainly a mixture of medical cases, which include elderly care patients, alongside patients with primary diabetic or endocrine conditions. 	The department holds a daily, Consultant-led trauma meeting whereby all referrals over the previous 24 hours are discussed and their corresponding radiographs displayed. This is a very valuable teaching opportunity and discussion is actively encouraged. Consultants will encourage open discussion about cases and promote learning about common Orthopaedic conditions.
	The department runs weekly Consultant-led departmental teaching. Teaching also takes place informally in clinics and theatres, where foundation doctors will have the support of a consultant or senior to guide them through their learning and development, both with hands-on experience and improving their knowledge base.

	When time allows, there is the opportunity to attend theatre (day- surgery list) for basic urology cases and to practice cystoscopy. FY2 doctors can attend clinics or theatre most days, however a lot of valuable experience can be gained in managing common urological problems on the inpatient wards, especially as there is a high turnover of patients.
	Whilst working in Urology you will carry out on calls in Surgery. This will provide you with exposure to deal with a variety of regular and emergency problems.
