Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	During this attachment you will be well supported both clinically and educationally with lots of opportunities to learn and develop skills in perioperative medicine and generic medicine essential for your ongoing career. During this placement you will have the opportunity to gain experience in the medical management of patients undergoing surgery. As you will be aware, treating older adults is uniquely challenging in terms of managing multimorbidity as well as needing to understand rehabilitation and discharge planning. You will be working as part of a multidisciplinary team (surgical, anaesthetic and therapy teams) which is a model which enables collaborative and holistic treatment of older surgical patients. Much of what you will learn during this attachment is directly linked to the foundation programme curriculum.
Main duties and further information about the placement	We are a geriatrician led multidisciplinary team who provide care to older or complex elective and emergency surgical patients throughout their surgical pathway. The team consists of: 2 consultant geriatricians, 1 middle grade doctor, 1 foundation doctor, 4 CNS, 1 OT (less than full time), 1 PT and 1 administrator. We work across surgical vascular, urology, elective orthopaedic and are due to start seeing elective general surgical patients (preop only). Our clinical workload consists of preoperative assessment and optimisation of older surgical patients with follow up through the pathway, providing ward based medical care, multidisciplinary rehab goal setting and discharge planning. This involves collaborative working with surgeons, anaesthetists, patients and their families. The foundation doctor roles are divided into; a) Ward based in-patient care b) out-patient c) No on call commitment – but can pick up oncall shifts if desired on vascular/urology.

On Wednesday there is a junior doctor led ward round followed by a senior review of all patients at a board round. Ward rounds are often a great learning opportunity since juniors are expected to present patients and to know the recent test results as well as trends. Discussion and ideas are encouraged. There is often a huge diversity of clinical presentations on the ward. Clinical presentations vary from Acute kidney injury, an acutely unwell transplant patient, dialysis patients admitted with medical or dialysis related issues. There are regular elective admissions for procedures (renal biopsies, dialysis line insertions), vascular dialysis access surgery (arterio-venous fistula formation and peritoneal dialysis catheter insertions/exchanges/removals) and patients undergoing interventional radiology procedures (fistuloplasties, renal artery stenting). The ward also has a procedure room where procedures such as dialysis line insertions and removals, native and transplant kidney biopsies, pleural and ascitic aspirations/drain insertions and lumbar punctures are performed. As a Foundation Doctor you will have the chance to place ultrasound guided central lines (for temporary dialysis/plasma exchange) and to remove tunnelled dialysis lines under supervision. There is a Daycase unit on the ward for renal patients requiring outpatient treatments, surgery or procedures and chemotherapy and blood transfusions. This is a nurse led facility but may call upon doctor support when required. There are opportunities to attend a variety of renal clinics ranging from general nephrology, transplant and living donation clinics, renal HOT clinics, hypertension, Young Persons transition renal clinics and genetics clinics to name a few.

At 8am there is handover from the night teams for new admissions, which we then review. After that, the ward rounds commence, split into cold (elective) ward round and hot (emergency) ward round with the registrar and/or on-call consultant. Often during the ward round other consultants will review their patients. After the ward round jobs (including catheterisation, cannulation, discharges, managing urosepsis, urinary retention, referrals, arranging appropriate antibiotic treatment, addressing concerns of families, arranging imaging etc.) are completed in order of priority whilst addressing emergencies that may come up on the ward throughout the day. There will be exposure to Urological emergencies and management of Urological/surgical patients both pre and post operatively. Once every month there is a morbidity and mortality meeting of all cases from the previous month, which dicusses patients who had post op complications or passed away. Therefore any complications must be recorded from the ward round to ensure they are included in the agenda.

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Cambridge J2, the main respiratory ward consists of 19 patients. There are seven respiratory consultants looking after the patients at any time in weekly rotation. The team consists of a mixture of junior and senior doctors, including a Higher Specialist Foundation Doctor, and dedicated nurses who are responsible for all patients on CJ2. Respiratory patients on the ward are those requiring specialist respiratory care, or with other acute general medical disease. There is a daily morning board round, in which all respiratory patients are discussed, mainly to clarify ongoing care and to estimate their expected date of discharge from hospital. After the ward round, the juniors are assigned to each of 3 bays (with 6 patients) and a side room. Consultants are available on every week day for morning ward rounds, and to review all patients in the late afternoons. There are currently only Respiratory Consultants on the wards during 50% of weekends. In the other weekend days, the consultant on call for GIM will be responsible for care of patients, usually with potential for cross site cover for advice for respiratory care. Ward round tends to be complete between 12:00 and 13:00 with ample opportunity for breaks. Aside from usual FY teaching, there is usually Radiology teaching with one of the Respiratory Consultants on a Monday, where a light lunch is provided with support of the pharmaceutical industry. Where the ward rounds need to continue, they do so after lunch break. Jobs are fairly standard for any medical ward with some completed immediately as the ward round occurs, e.g. prescribing or crossing off drugs on electronic charts. Clinical activity continues after the ward round, such as procedures, completion of electronic discharge summaries (EDNs) with discharge medication, ordering investigations, writing referrals on Careflow (the IT system for referrals), liaising with other teams to make referrals or ask for advice, speaking with patients or relatives regarding their progress, or referring
	patients to the Med Reg at Canterbury hospital to be sent there (because they're medically fit but just in hospital for social/physio reasons). Practical procedures, range from taking blood tests or inserting cannulas that are difficult, adjusting non-invasive ventilation, or pleural drain
	insertion/care which are always supervised by at least a Registrar-grade doctor competent in ultrasound. The respiratory ward will have more critically ill patients than many other wards, so there is ample opportunity to develop medical skills in managing such patients and end of life matters, always with appropriate support. There is a separate

The ward also has a procedure room where procedures such as dialysis line insertions and removals, native and transplant kidney biopsies, pleural and ascitic aspirations/drain insertions and lumbar punctures are performed. East Kent Job Description (JD) for the four-month academic placement

Type of Programme

The aim is to introduce Foundation doctors to academic medicine, in order to encourage individuals to undertake research training and consider a clinical academic career.

Employing trust:

East Kent Hospitals University NHS Foundation Trust

Academic placement based at:

Both the F1 and F2 posts are based within East Kent Hospitals University NHS Foundation Trust but may be at any of the sites: Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother Hospital (Margate), the Kent and Canterbury Hospital (Canterbury) or the William Harvey Hospital (Ashford). The academic rotation itself will be based in one of the education centres in either Margate, Ashford or Canterbury but will involve working Trustwide.

Brief outline of department:

Our Medical Education Department is responsible for the education and training of over 700 doctors-in-training and over 500 medical students per year. We also support the provision of continuing professional development for all our locally employed doctors and Associate Specialist and Specialist Doctors. We are one of the largest, acute trusts in the country with a wide and diverse population across clinical settings.

Our Specialised Foundation Programmes (SFPs) will support some Foundation Doctors to develop academic skills in addition to the clinical skills that are gained during the foundation years. The SFP in East Kent Hospitals University NHS Foundation Trust will provide excellent opportunities to develop Research, Education and Teaching and Leadership and Management skills in addition to the standard competencies outlined in the curriculum.

We very much hope the programme will inspire and encourage successful individuals to pursue a career in Academic Medicine or Medical Education in the future. As with all Foundation Programmes, the primary aim of the SFP is to enable doctors to acquire and demonstrate the competencies described in the Foundation Programme Curriculum. Doctors on the SFP are required to maintain the same clinical skill level as those on a purely clinical programme, which means that SFP doctors must perform their academic work in addition to their foundation training.

Each programme starts with a generic clinical F1 year which allows for newly qualified doctors to gain experience in a range of clinical posts, with the F2 year having one 4 month rotation focusing upon academic elements alongside additional clinical experience in the other 2 rotations.



F1 doctors will meet with their academic supervisor(s) during their first year in order to discuss and plan for the following year and to prepare any necessary ethics applications. They will be encouraged to network with our Medical Education Clinical Fellows during their first year in preparation for collaboration with them in their F2 year.

The 4- month dedicated medical education placement will involve work, outcomes and competencies as indicated below

Structure of project/what is expected

We will discuss with successful applicants the specific nature of work and projects that will develop the academic competencies that the year should help develop.

Indicative outcomes and the competencies able to be developed:

Outcomes: Adapts teaching style to different learner needs and to different learning environments.

Competencies:

- Describes and critically appraises the major pedagogic theories.
- · Adapts teaching style, as appropriate, during learning events.
- Applies these theories to different professional groups, at different career stages (e.g. medical students, doctors, nurses) in different settings e.g. small groups (e.g. seminars, bed side teaching) and large groups (e.g. lecture theatres).

Examples of relevant supporting evidence

- Lesson plans.
- Feedback from participants.
- Reflective logs on teaching sessions.

Content suggestions for programme designers

- Provide educational sessions and electronic resources that cover pedagogic theories.
- Provide opportunities for foundation doctors to teach different professional groups in different settings.

Outcome: Develops and/or completes a piece of medical education research. Competencies

- Performs a systematic review of the literature.
- Formulates a credible/realistic research question.
- Describes different research methods available.

Examples of relevant supporting evidence

- A completed manuscript.
- An accepted abstract at a local/national/international meeting.

Content suggestions for programme designers

- Educational session that explores the techniques for completing funding applications and the principles of full economic costing.
- Guidance and resources to identify suggested funding sources.

Outcome(s): Presents a project proposal to senior colleagues



Competencies

- Produces a high impact written document.
- Delivers an effective, high impact power point presentation.
- Adapts presentation style to the specific audience.
- Responds positively to feedback.
