Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>LIAISON PSYCHIATRY: Broadly the Working Age Adult Liaison Psychiatry clinical work falls into three categories: emergency department, in and out patient. The work is busy, but varied, and involves assessment of referrals from the general medical and surgical wards as well as patients following DSH and in the Emergency Department.</p> <p>There are also outpatient referrals from various medical specialties and opportunities for the post holder to see the full range of psychiatric presentations in a general hospital, including mood, somatoform and anxiety disorders etc.; organic (delirium, dementia, atypical psychoses etc.), medically unexplained symptoms, addictive disorders ,and much more!</p> <p>Our multidisciplinary team of doctors, nurses and psychologists are very supportive and enthusiastic. As a foundation doctor you will learn psychiatric assessment skills, enhance your psychosocial management plans and understand the challenges and rewards of working with complex multiple pathology relating to body, mind and brain, and encouraging an integrated approach to illness and disease. The nature of the work means that co-ordination and multi-disciplinary resources are invaluable and good communication and close working with Community and Primary care services is essential. The service has an excellent Health Psychology service and foundation doctors will be encouraged to get experience in this department. Similarly, the Old Age Liaison Psychiatry service will be able to provide experience for assessing patients with dementia, delirium and late onset disorders.
