Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Acute Internal Medicine at St Peter's Hospital is based on the Clinical Assessment Unit (CAU) and the Same Day Emergency Care Unit (SDEC) which are part of the Urgent and Emergency Care (UEC) Division. The Medical Short Stay Unit is a hybrid of Acute Medicine, General Medicine and some other specialties in the Division of General and Specialist Medicine (GSM)</p> <p>The CAU has a mixture of medical patients that are admitted to hospital with clinical conditions that are expected to be managed within a short length of stay. The unit also receives specialty in-reaching from medical specialties such as Respiratory, Gastroenterology, Neurology and Rheumatology for example; and the footprint of the unit is also shared with Surgical specialties who have patients there which lends to increased collaborative working between Medicine and the Surgical and Multi-Specialty teams.</p> <p>On CAU there are daily Consultant Led Board and Ward (or Clinical) rounds, there is opportunity for practical procedure participation and enhancement of clinical skills and the management of the deteriorating patient with senior supervision. There is a multi-disciplinary team of nurses, social services, Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists and other allied health groups too. The SDEC is a unit that is medically staffed by Foundation Year 2 doctors and above.</p> <p>The Short Stay Unit is a busy unit similar in clinical functioning to the CAU and Multi-Disciplinary Team approach to patient care. There are General Medicine and Specialty patients here too. On both CAU and Short Stay Unit clinical education and training will be a mixture of clinical rounds, board rounds and attendance at intra-departmental teaching sessions and Acute Medicine Learning events and Tea Trolley teaching too alongside the Divisional Grand Round.</p>
Main duties and further information about the placement	Doctors allocated to Acute Medicine at Foundation Year 1 Level can expect to rotate between the CAU and the Short Stay Unit only, not the SDEC.

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>With such a wide range of interests the department offers an excellent opportunity for F1 doctors to develop practical skills relevant to all branches of medicine and to observe and understand the pivotal role of appropriate and timely investigation in the management of acute and chronic illness.</p> <p>Their clinical roles include supervising the CT cardiac list under supervision of cardiac radiologist consultants and CT cardiac superintendents and assisting radiology registrars and consultants on day-to-day running of the department.</p> <p>The F1 doctor in the radiology department should become familiar with common radiology procedures given on the list at the start of placement. They also will have the opportunity to complete the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Visit interventional patients on the wards before and after procedures • Pre consent the patient for the procedures and discuss concerns and medical conditions • Communicate with nurses and radiologists • F1 doctors will have the opportunity to present interesting cases with the support of seniors.

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>The F1 will typically spend the majority of their working time in ICU, but with the opportunity to work in Anaesthetics where time permits. While on ICU, the doctor will take part in the daily handover and ward rounds, will look after individual patients and accompany the outreach team.</p> <p>If the doctor spend time in Anaesthetics, this will be attached to a theatre list. The doctor will see the patient before surgery with a trained Anaesthetists and be involved in undertaking the anaesthetic for the individual patient and attend the acute pain ward round. Types of list attended are variable and personal interest will be accommodated where possible.</p> <p>The overall educational objectives of the F1 year are to provide the doctor with knowledge, skills and attributes to be able to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Take anaesthetic related history and examination • Identify and synthesise problems specific to anaesthetics/critical care e.g. difficult airway • Prescribe safely, undertake fluid management and give blood products • Keep accurate and relevant medical records • Communicate effectively with patients, relatives and colleagues/medical team • Use evidence, guidelines and audit to benefit patient care • Act in a professional manner at all times • Cope with ethical and legal issues which occur during the management of patients with general medical problems and anaesthetic complications • Become life-long learners, teachers and leaders • Specific learning opportunities include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Airway training including intubations ○ Vascular access, invasive and non-invasive cardiac out monitoring ○ Possible regional anaesthetic techniques ○ Acute pain management ○ Identify the sick patient and initiating treatment including fluid management and use of inotropes

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>The Endocrinology and Diabetes rotation at St Peter's comprises of General Medicine with some Acute Care case mix and the occasional admission and care of patients that have been admitted via the unselected medical take who have an endocrine disorder, or diabetes or rheumatological disorder.</p> <p>The bulk of the patients in this Specialty are managed in the out-patients setting. There is no dedicated Take for this group of patients. In this rotation, exposure to General medicine and management of patients with a range of clinical presentation from the unselected take, or from the SDEC where it has been clinically determined that they will need further in-patient care and investigation.</p> <p>The team is as such amalgamated from a range of Specialties including the Registrars who are Specialty Registrars in Endocrinology or Rheumatology. The Consultants are a mix of General Internal Medicine Consultants with Specialty interests too.</p> <p>It is possible to attend clinics and participate in intra-departmental teaching session, as well as the supervision of medical students too.</p>
