Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	Acute Internal Medicine at St Peter's Hospital is based on the Clinical Assessment Unit (CAU) and the Same Day Emergency Care Unit (SDEC) which are part of the Urgent and Emergency Care (UEC) Division.
	The CAU has a mixture of medical patients that are admitted to hospital with clinical conditions that are expected to be managed within a short length of stay. The unit also receives specialty in-reaching from medical specialties sucl as Respiratory, Gastroenterology, Neurology and Rheumatology for example; and the footprint of the unit is also shared with Surgical specialties who have patients there which lends to increased collaborative working between Medicine and the Surgical and Multi-Specialty teams.
	On CAU there are daily Consultant Led Board and Ward (or Clinical) rounds, there is opportunity for practical procedure participation and enhancement or clinical skills and the management of the deteriorating patient with senior supervision. There is a multi-disciplinary team of nurses, social services, Occupational Therapists, Physiotherapists and other allied health groups too. The SDEC is a unit that is medically staffed by Foundation Year 2 doctors and above.
	Education and training will be a mixture of clinical rounds, board rounds and attendance at Tea Trolley teaching too alongside the Divisional Grand Round.

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	The F1 will typically spend the majority of their working time in ICU, but with the opportunity to work in Anaesthetics where time permits. While on ICU, the doctor will take part in the daily handover and ward rounds, will look after individual patients and accompany the outreach team. If the doctor spends time in Anaesthetics, this will be attached to a theatre list. The doctor will see the patient before surgery with a trained Anaesthetists and be involved in undertaking the anaesthetic for the individual patient and attend the acute pain ward round. Types of lists attended are variable and personal interest will be accommodated where possible. The overall educational objectives of the F1 year are to provide the doctor with knowledge, skills and attributes to be able to: • Identify and synthesise problems specific to anaesthetics/critical care e.g. difficult airway (although the responsibility for troubleshooting a difficult airway is on airway trained registrars or consultants) • Prescribe safely, undertake fluid management and give blood products • Keep accurate and relevant medical records • Communicate effectively with patients, relatives and colleagues/medical team • Use evidence, guidelines and audit to benefit patient care • Act in a professional manner at all times • Cope with ethical and legal issues which occur during the management of patients with general medical problems and anaesthetic complications • Become life-long learners, teachers and leaders • Specific learning opportunities include: • Airway training including intubations • Vascular access, invasive and non-invasive cardiac out monitoring • Possible regional anaesthetic techniques • Acute pain management • Identify the sick patient and initiating treatment including fluid management and use of inotropes There is a teaching session every Tuesday at 14:30.

In addition, the post holder will also participate in weekly multidisciplinary clinical team, referral and monthly business meetings and daily MDT meetings. The F1 may also be expected to get involved in teaching medical students.

Main duties and further information about the placement

Ash ward

This is the paediatrics inpatient ward. There is an HDU bay, 3 Clinical Bays and several cubicles with patient numbers up to 20-23 depending on staffing levels

There is a consultant led handover and ward round daily with more frequent patient reviews as needed in between. The F1 is an integral member of the team and will be involved with ward round and ward jobs. There will also be "results to chase" for discharged patients and investigations to organise. As well as 'paediatric' patients, there are patients under the care of surgical, ENY, orthopaedic and gynaecological teams. Whilst the paediatric team does not become involved in the day-to-day care of surgical patients unless requested, the team does have an overall responsibility for these patients (to ensure that they are receiving the best care, particularly regarding pain control, fluids and antibiotics).

Oak Ward

This is the day ward, where ENT and surgical patients are admitted before surgery. There is usually a dedicated Oak Ward SHO to oversee this area. Patients also attend for investigations including blood tests, MRI under



	sedation, food challenges and endocrine tests and these are an excellent bear opportunity for learning. Paediatric A&E Paediatrics A&E has walk-in patients who are usually seen by A&E doctors in the paediatric A&E department. Paediatrics doctors see patients who are referred from A&E, via GP (letter or call), if they have Open Access or if they are triaged as requiring Paediatric review by the nurses. In A&E F1s are part of the Paediatric Team and can see patients and then
	discuss them with seniors. Attempts at venepuncture/cannulation can be undertaken with support initially – use Ametop of sweetease solution according to age. If there are no paediatric referrals but several A&E patients, it is useful and helpful to see these patients and present the A&E senior doctors.
	Paediatric "results to chase" from PED to be reviewed & actioned. NICU There are several areas in the Neonatal Unit. Room 1 is Intensive Care
	Room 3 is High Dependency Room 2 is Special Care. There is also the Transitional Care unit on the postnatal ward (Joan Booker ward) where babies stay with their mothers whilst having IV antibiotics, phototherapy or nasogastric feeds.

Main duties and further information about the placement

Ashford and St Peters Specialist Palliative Care Team

The post holder will play a key role in the multi-disciplinary specialist palliative care team at St Peter's Hospital. The team sees over 1500 new referrals each year from inpatients and outpatients. The team provide specialist palliative care advice for symptom control and end of life car within the hospital. A key role of the team is to support the discharge of patients to their preferred place of care which requires regular liaison with community services including GPs, hospice teams and district nursing teams. The team have a weekly MDT attended by community colleagues where the F1 will gain experience of working with the multi-professional team including clinical nurse specialists, occupational therapists and chaplaincy.

The team also provides input into the community steering group, community MND MDT and a number of oncology MDTs. The post holder will also play a role in providing support to the specialist palliative care beds.

Whilst at ASPH, the F1 postholder is expected to participate in the GIM on-call rota.

Woking & Sam Beare Hospice

The post holder will play a key role in the multi-disciplinary specialist palliative care team predominantly based on the inpatient 20 bed ward at Woking Hospice. They will work within the medical team which includes Consultants, HSTs and Specialty doctors but will gain experience working with other areas of the hospice including the Well-Being Centre and the community clinical nurse specialist nursing team. They will gain experience of working with the multi-professional team including clinical nurse specialists, social workers, physiotherapists, occupational therapists, counsellors, complimentary therapy and chaplaincy.

An honorary contract will be issued by the hospice for this placement and doctors will need to inform their medical indemnity cover that they are working within a hospice.

Princess Alice Hospice



The post holder will provide specialist palliative care input for the hospice inpatients and community to adult patients aged 18 and over with a range of life limiting illnesses.

The opportunity for multi-agency working is excellent, the working environment is friendly and there are a number of junior and senior doctors working within the Hospice.

The majority of time is spent managing inpatients on the wards and admitting new admissions. Time will also be spent with the community team seeing patients in their own homes or as outpatients with a consultant, HSR or shadowing the palliative care specialist nurses.

There are weekly MDTs for both inpatients and for community teams. There will also be the opportunity to attend the GP GSF meetings, the community MND MDT and the Enhanced supportive care team daily meeting where complex community palliative care patients are discussed, and daily management plans adjusted. The FY1 will also complete administrative tasks related to patient care including liaising with relevant internal external clinical and non-clinical teams.
