INTRODUCTION

Sussex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust consists of some 4,500 passionate and dedicated clinicians and support staff, working hand in hand with partners in the community to care for and support vulnerable people. We provide NHS care and treatment for people living in Brighton and Hove, East and West Sussex and Hampshire. We also provide a range of specialist services across south east England.

We are one of the largest providers of children and young people's mental health services in England, delivering community services in Sussex and Hampshire. We provide services in places including hospital (we have about 650 inpatients beds), people's homes, community centres, GP practices and prison. Our services in Sussex care for people with mental health problems, learning disabilities and an addiction to drugs or alcohol.

We are one of the few mental health organisations to have been granted university status by the Association of UK University Hospitals. This recognises our achievements in bringing research, teaching and clinical care more closely together for the benefit of patients.

As a teaching trust of Brighton and Sussex Medical School we have a national reputation for leading-edge research. During 2013-14 our research activity generated £1.6 million income. We are now one of the most influential, effective and well-respected mental health trusts in the country, and, as a teaching trust of Brighton and Sussex Medical School: We started as Sussex Partnership NHS trust in April 2006 and became a Foundation Trust with teaching status in August 2008.

JOB CONTENT

Job outline:	<p>This is a 4-month placement, as part of the Foundation Training programme, which is split between Connolly House in Chichester (2.5 days) and the Forensic Healthcare Service based at The Chichester Centre, Low Secure Forensic Unit, Fir ward (2.5 days).</p> <p>The Chichester Centre (Chichester)</p> <p>The Chichester Centre comprises three low secure forensic wards: Fir & Pine (male); Hazel (female). The post will be attached primarily to Fir Ward, a 17 bedded male low secure forensic unit.</p> <p>The post holder will join a full multidisciplinary team including ward manager, nursing staff, occupational therapist, psychologist, social worker and administrative support. The medical team consists of one Acting up Consultant Psychiatrist (who will act as Clinical Supervisor) and one Consultant Forensic Psychiatrist.</p> <p>The post holder will gain experience in management of patients considered to pose specific challenges to services, including heightened risk of aggression/violence, and in need of specialist risk assessment and management. The majority of patients when discharged will be subject to Section 41 of the Mental Health Act 1983.</p> <p>The post holder will gain experience of Forensic cases in Mental Health Review Tribunals and hospital manager's hearings.</p> <p>Connolly House (Chichester)</p> <p>Connolly House is a 14 bedded mixed gender rehabilitation unit in Chichester. It provides inpatient specialist assessment, treatment, and interventions to enable recovery of people with complex mental health needs.</p> <p>The inpatient Rehabilitation psychiatric unit pride themselves on their multi-disciplinary team approach to patient care. In addition to an acting up consultant psychiatrist, we have a consultant clinical psychologist, junior and senior nursing staff and a very dynamic occupational therapy team offering a full weekly programme of activities.</p> <p>The philosophy of the service is of empowerment for the individual, aiming to establish a partnership with patients and carers so that they can make informed decisions about the management of their illness. We work closely with community teams and other outside agencies (housing, voluntary and statutory organisations) in partnership with patients we aim to enable them to reach their goals and succeed in their recovery pathway.</p> <p>This post will provide the FY1 doctor with experience in inpatient work on an open rehabilitation mental health unit. It will provide exposure to a wide variety of clinical presentations including substance use problems.</p> <p>Psychiatric patients have significantly increased morbidity and decreased life expectancy; this may be related to a combination of factors including poor diet, alcohol misuse, smoking and lifestyle choices. We have implemented a process of health checks and monitoring. The FY1 will work with the team to ensure that all appropriate physical health checks have been carried out using NEWS. The</p>
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	<p>FY1 role may be further developed with ward staff to deliver tailored individualised health education, which may include advice on smoking cessation, safe use of alcohol, healthy eating etc.</p>
Clinical Responsibilities:	<p>The role of the FY1 doctor will be to do physical examinations and be a part of the MDT team in assessing and managing the patients in the unit.</p> <p>The FY1 will also be able to participate and observe in the assessment of new patients into the service, their ongoing management, investigations, developing Care Plan and management. The FY1 trainees will have opportunity to review patients individually and to present them at ward round discussions.</p> <p>This placement gives exposure to safe prescribing and risk assessment for the management of Mental Health problems.</p> <p>The post holder's work will involve attending ward rounds, clerking admission and writing discharge summaries under supervision. You will be well supported by the clinical supervisor and the MDT. Attending the local academic programme on Wednesdays is essential.</p>
Clinical Supervision:	<p>The FY1 doctor will have direct access to an appropriate senior colleague for advice in any clinical situation. In most situations between 9:00-17:00, this will be the Consultant of the team, who will also act as the clinical supervisor for training and quality assurance purposes; they will offer on average one hour per week of protected clinical supervision.</p>
Learning opportunities and competencies expected to be achieved:	<p>This post is conducive to developing the vast majority of the generic competencies required by the Foundation Programme Curriculum 2021.</p> <p>HLO 1.
