Main duties and further information about the placement	<p>This is a 4-month placement, as part of the Year 1 KSS Foundation School training programme.</p> <p>This FY1 post is based four days per week at the Forget Me Not Unit, which comprises three 10-bedded specialist dementia inpatient wards.</p> <p>The majority of people with dementia can live within the community. A very small proportion will have more complex care needs which require specialist care in a dedicated setting. Specialist dementia wards support people with dementia to allow them to safely move to a community-based environment, such as their own home or, more commonly, a care home. The FY1 doctor is tasked with monitoring and managing the physical and mental health of these patients, managing complex and often unmet needs of these patient in a holistic way as part of a multidisciplinary team with support from Specialty Doctors and a Consultant Old Age Psychiatrist.</p> <p><i>One day per week is spent working on the Emergency Floor at Worthing Hospital.</i></p>																		
Clinical Supervisor(s) <i>This may be subject to change</i>	Dr Josef Mahdi. The doctor will always have direct access to an appropriate senior colleague for advice in any clinical situation. In most situations between 9:00-17:00 this will be the Specialty Doctor. The consultant will also act as the Clinical Supervisor for training and quality assurance purposes and will offer on average one hour per week direct face-to-face clinical supervision .

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>This is a FY1 post based at Worthing General Hospital in the Mental Health Liaison Team (MHLT). This service provides urgent mental health assessments for patients who are referred to us within Worthing Hospital, from the emergency department and hospital wards. Worthing MHLT accepts referrals for any patient over the age of 17. There is a separate CAMHS liaison service which the FY1 doctor may be able to shadow if they are interested but they will not be working directly with children and adolescents.</p> <p>The FY1 doctor will learn how to assess patients presenting with a wide range of mental illness, including psychiatric history taking, mental state examination, risk assessment and formulating management plans. They will learn about the overlap between physical and mental illness and about the psychological impact of chronic physical illness. They will learn how to complete holistic assessments, to take a patient-centred approach to medicine, and develop more advanced communication skills.</p>

Main duties and further information about the placement	<p>The FY1 doctor will work alongside consultant psychiatrists, psychiatric trainees and specialist mental health nurses in the Mental Health Liaison Team, assessing and providing urgent management and treatment plans for patients presenting with a mental health emergency to the general hospital (emergency department and hospital wards).</p> <p>The FY1 doctor will initially carry out joint assessments with other members of the team but gradually build their skills and confidence to carry out independent assessments and reviews of patients on the ward. There will always be more senior members of staff available for the FY1 doctor to discuss cases with. The FY1 doctor will not be expected to put discharge plans in place on their own and will be supported in developing care plans for patients.</p> <p>A large part of the work involves liaising with other teams and services to ensure joined-up holistic care for the patient and to support safe and effective discharge planning. This may be liaising with other teams and departments within the hospital, with a range of mental health services in the community, with GPs and primary care and with other allied professions such as social care and tertiary sector.</p> <p>One day a week (Tuesdays) will be spent working with the acute medical team on the Emergency Floor at Worthing General Hospital, to ensure the FY1 doctor gains necessary medical experience and skills as part of their training.</p> <p>The hours of work with MHLT are usually 9am - 5pm. Hours of work on the Emergency Floor vary according to the rota, which will be sent out in advance. There is no on call rota attached to this placement.</p> <p>This is a 4 month placement, as part of the Year 1 KSS Foundation School training programme.</p>
Clinical Supervisor(s) <i>This may be subject to change</i>	<p>The doctor will always have direct access to an appropriate senior colleague for advice in any clinical situation. From Monday - Wednesday, Consultant Liaison Psychiatrist Dr Claire Jones will be available to support and advise. On Thursday and Friday, Consultant Older Adults Liaison Psychiatrist Dr Jerzy Strukowski will be available for the FY1 doctor to consult. There are also other trainee psychiatrists, a team lead and clinical nurse specialist available to give clinical advice and supervise the FY1's work where appropriate.</p> <p>Dr Jones will act as the clinical supervisor for training and quality assurance purposes and will offer on average one hour per week direct face to face clinical supervision.</p>

Main duties and further information about the placement	<p>The post will be based at Arun House, 16 Liverpool Gardens, Worthing BN11 1RY.</p> <p>The post holder will provide psychiatric and physical healthcare input to patients with psychosis spectrum disorders and wide comorbidities across the age range 14 to 65. The opportunity to develop skills in multi-disciplinary working is excellent and the working environment is very friendly.</p> <p>The Early Intervention team for Psychosis in Worthing manages an active caseload of around 80 clients with early psychosis aged up to 65. The service has a primary youth mental health focus and collaborates widely with relevant locality third sector organisations.</p> <p>The team comprises lead practitioners of mixed professional training, a team manager, senior clinical psychologist, pharmacist, vocational support worker, administrative staff, and 0.6 of an adult psychiatry consultant.</p> <p>Training Opportunities: This post provides a wide range of training opportunities that can be flexibly incorporated into the program of each doctor depending on their needs, as detailed below. There is a specific focus on effective team working, consultative practice and risk assessment within this team.</p> <p>Community psychiatry: Whilst management of first presentation psychosis is a primary focus, the team commonly manages a wide range of comorbidity and those presenting with diagnostic uncertainty require a high standard of skills in assessment.</p> <p>Inpatient in-reach: A key component to consistency of patient care.</p> <p>Youth mental health: This is an important element of the work of an EIP team, being mindful of developmental issues of the patient and with clear focus on flexible service engagement.</p> <p>Understanding of the Mental Health Act For admissions and those on community orders.</p> <p>Psychopharmacology: Effective, safe and collaborative use of medications is a particular focus of this placement with specialist supervision from team pharmacist Nik Nikolis and Dr Chatterjee. Critical analysis of existing literature in this field is integral.</p> <p>Psychotherapy: Involvement with psychoeducation, engagement and collaborative working, family work and group therapy is available on top of the usual individual therapy exposure provided at locality level.</p> <p>Research and applied audit: The team has an active interest and experience in audit and research. We accept that trainees may come to the department with limited or no experience in ENT, so the first Thursday of each rotation is spent at the ENT emergency induction course – a long standing, all day course run by registrars and consultants which takes place in RSCH Brighton.

On starting formally in Worthing (first Friday of rotation) we run a local induction and begin a 2-week supernumerary period in which the bleep / clinic is typically covered by our trust grade doctors to give time to settle into rotation and learn required skills.

Generally the feedback from the ENT SHO's in the past has been highly positive. The rotation in particular allows the opportunity to manage patients in a niche specialty from start to finish and is particularly suited to hard working trainees who enjoy "hands on" approach to learning. By the end of the rotation we expect trainees to be able to cauterise or pack a nose after nose bleed, drain abscesses, microsuction ears and perform flexible nasendoscopy to examine the nose, throat and airway. Surgical skills can be gained in theatre. There is opportunity for exposure to outpatient clinics in which management of chronic ENT conditions can be gained. ENT is one of the rare specialties where both adult and children are part of the take. It is an invaluable opportunity for those with an interest in Surgery and anaesthetics, but also those considering a career as a GP or paediatrics where up to 30% of all presentations relate to ENT in some way.

On 1st April 2021 Western Sussex NHS Trust merged with Brighton and Sussex University Hospitals NHS Trust to form the new University Hospitals Sussex NHS Foundation Trust making a combined trust of 7 hospitals across Sussex.

Both St Richard's and Worthing hospitals provide a full range of acute hospital care including accident and emergency services, acute medical care, maternity & children's services and a range of surgical specialties. Southlands Hospital provides outpatient and diagnostic services, and day case procedures. It is home to our new £7.5m Western Sussex

Eye Care.

Our services are predominantly commissioned by the NHS Coastal West Sussex Clinical Commissioning Group, with whom we are committed to providing high quality integrated care across the local health economy.

We are also committed to working closely with our provider of community hospitals, Sussex Community NHS Trust, and the local provider of mental health services, Sussex Partnership NHS Foundation Trust. The Trust does not provide tertiary services and looks towards Brighton, Portsmouth and Southampton for these services.
