The unit comprises 5 consultants, 2 SpRs, a CT2 trainee and 2 FY1 posts; the team is supported by 4 cancer CNSs, and 2 stoma care specialist nurses. The unit has a vibrant cancer MDT with specialist expertise in enhanced recovery, papillon and minimally invasive surgery (laparoscopic & robotic). 2023 figures show we have the lowest length of stay in the country for both colon and rectal major resection. We partner with the internationally renowned minimal access training unit headed by Prof Rockall which runs regular RCS skills course. We treat advanced colorectal cancer and support gynaecology and urology cancer units with synchronous resections. We are a national bowel cancer screening hub. Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>The Geriatric medicine department currently has 8.3 full time equivalent consultants. The department has an award winning Acute Frailty Service operating on the Emergency Floor 5 days per week. This service has expanded to include a Frailty specific Same Day Emergency Care facility and a Hospital at Home service. Other services include 3 frailty units in the Hospital mainframe and the stroke service which takes patients following acute treatment from Frimley Park Hospital. One consultant and two Associate Specialists run the orthogeriatric service looking after all patients admitted with hip fracture and the Milford Community Frailty Unit established during the pandemic. The department also oversees the Milford Integrated Care Hub (MICH) offering proactive Comprehensive Geriatric Assessment to community dwelling older people living with frailty and patients living with Parkinsons Disease. The department also contributes to the acute general medical on call, managing acute frailty services at weekends until 2pm.</p> <p>The FY1 post is based on one of the thirty bedded acute geriatric medicine wards receiving complex frail elderly patients from the emergency assessment unit. This post is part of a team led by two consultants, a SpR, with 1 GPST, 3 FY2 and 2 FY1 doctors.</p> <p>Geriatric medicine is an ideal early post enabling junior doctors to become confident in managing multiple co-morbidities, polypharmacy, chronic disease management, working closely with the whole multidisciplinary team and often relatives or carers in ensuring the best possible outcome for this often vulnerable group of patients. The department has established a Frailty Academy, offering the opportunity to achieve Tier 1 and Tier 2 training of the Frailty Capabilities Framework.</p> <p>Weekly teaching is delivered where Foundation Doctors can develop skills and knowledge in identifying, understanding and managing frailty and to become a Frailty Champion. Foundation teaching is every Wednesday and Journal club for all physicians every Thursday. Foundation doctors are strongly encouraged to attend these teaching sessions.</p>

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>The foundation doctor is based on the twenty-nine bedded stroke unit, of which 12 are stroke and 12 are frailty. This post is part of a team led by two consultants, a specialty doctor, a registrar, with a GP trainee, one FY2 doctor and three FY1 doctors. Stroke medicine provides excellent specialist training to junior doctors. There is the opportunity to learn how to manage patients throughout the different stages of their rehabilitation including the acute presentation and thrombolysis, aspects of neuro-rehabilitation and understanding stroke aetiology. In addition, the post enables junior doctors to become confident in managing medical complications of stroke and multiple comorbidities. We work closely with the multidisciplinary team, relatives and carers ensure the best possible outcome for patients. The post includes on call for acute medicine and post take duties supported by the team. The department has established a Frailty Academy, offering the opportunity to achieve Tier 1 and Tier 2 training of the Frailty Capabilities Framework. Weekly teaching is delivered where Foundation Doctors can develop skills and knowledge in identifying, understanding and managing frailty and to become a Frailty Champion. Foundation teaching is every Wednesday and Journal club for all physicians every Thursday. Within the stroke team there are weekly neuro-radiology meetings and weekly vascular meetings to consider cases for endarterectomy. Foundation doctors are strongly encouraged to attend these teaching sessions.</p>
