Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	During this attachment, you will be well supported both clinically and educationally, with lots of opportunities to learn and develop skills in perioperative medicine and generic medicine essential for your ongoing career. During this placement you will have the opportunity to gain experience in the medical management of patients undergoing surgery. As you will be aware, treating older adults is uniquely challenging in terms of managing multimorbidity, as well as needing to understand rehabilitation and discharge planning. You will be working as part of a multidisciplinary team (surgical, anaesthetic and therapy teams) which is a model which enables collaborative and holistic treatment of older surgical patients. Much of what you will learn during this attachment is directly linked to the foundation programme curriculum.
Main duties and further information about the placement	We are a geriatrician-led multidisciplinary team that provides care to older or complex elective and emergency surgical patients throughout their surgical pathway. The team consists of: 2 consultant geriatricians, 1 middle grade doctor, 1 foundation doctor, 4 CNS, 1 OT (less than full time), 1 PT and 1 administrator. We work across vascular, urology, elective orthopaedic in Canterbury Hospital and general surgical patients in QEQM. Our clinical workload consists of preoperative assessment and optimisation of older surgical patients with follow up through the pathway, providing ward based medical care, multidisciplinary rehab goal setting and discharge planning. This involves collaborative working with surgeons, anaesthetists, patients, and their families. The foundation doctor roles are divided into: a) Ward-based in-patient care b) Out-patient c) No on-call commitment – but you can pick up on-call shifts if desired, particularly in vascular/urology.

You should complete exception reports as necessary.</p> <p>Handover is an inevitable part of any medical job. In particular, you will need to hand over any outstanding tasks for clinic patients when you leave the POPS role or before annual leave (AL). Please ensure you hand over to the person coming in your place. Email is usually best, with the consultant copied in.</p>

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	A typical working day starts with the MDT morning board round at 08:30 am, followed by the ward round at 09:00 am. The F1 doctor is expected to update the patient handover list during the board round and update any outstanding assessments, i.e. VTE and review EWS score. There are two Consultant-led ward rounds each week and two Registrar-led ward rounds. On Wednesday, there is a resident doctor-led ward round, followed by a senior review of all patients at a board round. Ward rounds are often a great learning opportunity, as juniors are expected to present patients and to know the recent test results as well as trends. Discussions around investigations and management plans and work-based assessments are encouraged. There is often a huge diversity of clinical presentations on the ward. Clinical presentations vary from acute kidney injury, acutely unwell transplant patient, dialysis patients admitted with medical or dialysis-related issues. There are regular elective admissions for procedures (renal biopsies, dialysis line insertions), vascular dialysis access surgery (arterio-venous fistula formation and peritoneal dialysis catheter insertions/exchanges/removals) and patients undergoing interventional radiology procedures (fistuloplasties, renal artery stenting). The ward also has a procedure room where procedures such as dialysis line insertions and removals, native and transplant kidney biopsies, pleural aspirations, ascitic drain insertions and lumbar punctures are performed. As a Foundation Doctor you will have the opportunity to place ultrasound-guided central lines (for temporary dialysis/plasma exchange) and to remove tunneled dialysis lines under supervision. There is a Daycase unit on the ward for renal patients requiring outpatient treatments, surgery or procedures, chemotherapy, and blood transfusions. This is a nurse-led facility but may call upon doctor support when required. There are opportunities to attend a variety of renal clinics ranging from general nephrology, transplant and living donation clinics, renal HOT clinics, hypertension, Young Persons' transition renal clinics, and genetics clinics, to name a few.
Main duties and further information about the placement	In addition to standard ward duties (organising the ward round, taking bloods, writing discharge summaries, etc). You will be expected to clerk in patients admitted to the ward via many routes of admission; direct admission from home/clinic bypassing emergency departments, direct admissions from dialysis units or transfers from another hospital. As this is a regional renal ward, there are many patients

	transferred from external Trusts, and the receiving ward for any patients stepped down from Intensive Care Units with single-organ kidney failure. Therefore, there are many opportunities to practice clerking, initiating management, and learn from expert multidisciplinary teams (dialysis and transplant specialist nurses, and renal pharmacists).

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>Cambridge J2, the main respiratory ward consists of 19 patients. There are seven respiratory consultants looking after the patients at any time in weekly rotation. The team consists of a mixture of junior and senior doctors, including a Higher Specialist Foundation Doctor, and dedicated nurses who are responsible for all patients on CJ2. Respiratory patients on the ward are those requiring specialist respiratory care, or with other acute general medical disease. There is a daily morning board round, in which all respiratory patients are discussed, mainly to clarify ongoing care and to estimate their expected date of discharge from hospital. After the ward round, the juniors are assigned to each of 3 bays (with 6 patients) and a side room. Consultants are available on every week day for morning ward rounds, and to review all patients in the late afternoons. There are currently only Respiratory Consultants on the wards during 50% of weekends. In the other weekend days, the consultant on call for GIM will be responsible for care of patients, usually with potential for cross site cover for advice for respiratory care. Ward round tends to be complete between 12:00 and 13:00 with ample opportunity for breaks. Aside from usual FY teaching, there is usually Radiology teaching with one of the Respiratory Consultants on a Monday, where a light lunch is provided with support of the pharmaceutical industry. Where the ward rounds need to continue, they do so after lunch break. Jobs are fairly standard for any medical ward with some completed immediately as the ward round occurs, e.g. prescribing or crossing off drugs on electronic charts. Clinical activity continues after the ward round, such as procedures, completion of electronic discharge summaries (EDNs) with discharge medication, ordering investigations, writing referrals on Careflow (the IT system for referrals), liaising with other teams to make referrals or ask for advice, speaking with patients or relatives regarding their progress, or referring patients to the Med Reg at Canterbury hospital to be sent there (because they're medically fit but just in hospital for social/physio reasons). Practical procedures, range from taking blood tests or inserting cannulas that are difficult, adjusting non-invasive ventilation, or pleural drain insertion/care which are always supervised by at least a Registrar-grade doctor competent in ultrasound. The respiratory ward will have more critically ill patients than many other wards, so there is ample opportunity to develop medical skills in managing such patients and end of life</p>

	matters, always with appropriate support. There is a separate Respiratory Consultant taking respiratory referrals from around the hospital and identifying admissions for CJ2, and a pleural team which includes another Respiratory Consultant who can offer assistance for inpatients who have pleural disease.

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>A typical day starts at 07:45, ensuring the list is updated, and that patients for theatre that morning have had G&S, blood clotting tests and any urgent cannulas. At 08:00, there is a handover from the night teams for new admissions, which we then review. After that, the ward rounds commence, split into the cold (elective) ward round and hot (emergency) ward round with the registrar and/or on-call consultant. Often, during the ward round, other consultants will review their patients. After the ward round, jobs (including catheterisation, cannulation, discharges, managing urosepsis, urinary retention, referrals, arranging appropriate antibiotic treatment, addressing concerns of families, arranging imaging, etc.) are completed in order of priority whilst addressing any emergencies that may arise on the ward throughout the day.</p> <p>There will be exposure to urological emergencies and management of urological/surgical patients both pre and post operatively.</p> <p>Once every month there is a morbidity and mortality meeting where we discuss patients who had complications or passed away. A list of suitable patients must be kept up to date on Careflow. You will attend the M&M to understand the process and learning points from each case. There is an educational afternoon after M&M which you should attend if the ward allows it.</p>

In the other weekend days, the consultant on call for GIM will be responsible for care of patients, usually with potential for cross site cover for advice for respiratory care. Ward round tends to be completed between 12:00 and 13:00 with ample opportunity for breaks. Aside from the usual Foundation teaching, there is usually Radiology teaching with one of the Respiratory Consultants on a Monday, where a light lunch is provided with support of the pharmaceutical industry. Where the ward rounds need to continue, they do so after lunch break. Jobs are fairly standard for any medical ward with some completed immediately as the ward round occurs, e.g. prescribing or crossing off drugs on electronic charts. Clinical activity continues after the ward round, such as procedures, completion of electronic discharge summaries (EDNs) with discharge medication, ordering investigations, writing referrals on Careflow (the IT system for referrals), liaising with other teams to make referrals or ask for advice, speaking with patients or relatives regarding their progress, or referring patients to the Med Reg at Canterbury hospital to be sent there (because they're medically fit but just in hospital for social/physio reasons).
