It is a general medical cohort of patients with a variety of presentations, giving you a great initial overview of medicine.</p> <p>While on call, you'll clerk patients in the Emergency Department or Same Day Emergency Care and then follow them to the Acute Medical Unit (AMU). There, you'll care for them for the next 72 hours, organizing and reviewing tests and facilitating discharge.</p> <p>As part of your on-call role, you'll manage the post-take of patients alongside the consultant, focusing solely on this cohort. This offers a valuable learning opportunity through direct engagement with the consultant. Ample chance to get work-based assessments done!</p> <p>The AMU is consultant run unit with daily morning rounds starting at 0800 hours. Three consultants round on approximately 14 patients each by lunch, while residents are assigned around 9 patients to manage. A daily multidisciplinary meeting helps facilitate discharges, supported by a team of FY2, IMT, ACCS and specialist registrars along with consultants to support.</p> <p>You will also be allocated a few shifts in Same Day Emergency Care (SDEC), allowing you to work closely with the consultant and gain hand-on experience with various procedures.</p>

Type of work to expect and learning opportunities	<p>LIAISON PSYCHIATRY: Broadly the Working Age Adult Liaison Psychiatry clinical work falls into three categories: emergency department, in and out patient. The work is busy, but varied, and involves assessment of referrals from the general medical and surgical wards as well as patients following DSH and in the Emergency Department. There are also outpatient referrals from various medical specialties and opportunities for the post holder to see the full range of psychiatric presentations in a general hospital, including mood, somatoform and anxiety disorders etc.; organic (delirium, dementia, atypical psychoses etc.), medically unexplained symptoms, addictive disorders, and much more. Our multidisciplinary team of doctors, nurses and psychologists are very supportive and enthusiastic. As a foundation doctor you will learn psychiatric assessment skills, enhance your psychosocial management plans and understand the challenges and rewards of working with complex multiple pathology relating to body, mind and brain, and encouraging an integrated approach to illness and disease. The nature of the work means that co-ordination and multi-disciplinary resources are invaluable and good communication and close working with Community and Primary care services is essential. The service has an excellent Health Psychology service and foundation doctors will be encouraged to get experience in this department. Similarly, the Old Age Liaison Psychiatry service will be able to provide experience for assessing patients with dementia, delirium and late onset disorders. Gaining better understanding of MCA 2005 and MHA 1983 and its application in acute hospital is an essential part of this post.</p> <p>Emergency medicine: The Foundation Doctor will work alongside FY1, FY2 and Higher Foundation doctors in Majors and EDOU with an intention of seeing patients with both acute psychiatric and medical conditions. The intention is to concentrate for a significant part of the time on patients with deliberate self-harm, poisoning and mental health disorders. There will be the opportunity to perform core procedures, SLEs and (dependant on shift patterns) the chance to attend the weekly resident doctors teaching both in the department and within the PGEC.</p>

The principal service provided by the team is assertive community outreach for people between the ages of 14-35 with an early psychotic illness. All common psychiatric disorders will be experienced in these young people. Most of the work undertaken will be in conjunction with/accompanied by the highly experienced multi- disciplinary team, and consideration will always be made of the training level of an FY1 doctor.</p> <p>Individual supervision will be provided by the approved Named Clinical Supervisor for one hour per week.
