There is extensive day surgery and in-patient operating lists, covering all aspects of Gynae surgery, other than oncology. We provide one-stop assessment and treatment of colposcopy and menorrhagia. All services are supported by a busy emergency service, co-located on the delivery suite and on the Gynae ward.</p>
